



Statutes:

Art. 1 Name

The association is known as "Chinese Union of Zurich" or "CUZ" and is governed by Art. 60 ff. of the Swiss Civil Code (ZGB). It is politically and religiously neutral.

The association is domiciled in Zurich.

Art. 2 Purpose

The purpose of the association is to promote the exchange of culture, economy, science, and technology between China and Switzerland, to enrich the communication among Chinese in the region of Zurich, and to help them integrate into Swiss society.

The association does not pursue any commercial ambitions.

Art. 3 Membership

The association consists of four kinds of members:

- a) Active and passive members: individuals and their spouses and children
- b) Student members: any persons studying or attending school in Switzerland and their spouses and children
- c) Honorary members: individuals designated by the general assembly

All members are required to pay an annual membership-fee as follows:

- a) Active members: CHF 20.00
- b) Student members: CHF 10.00

Passive and Honorary members: Exempt from paying membership-fee

The voting rights of all members are designated as follows:

- a) Active members: One vote per membership
- b) Student members: One vote per membership

Passive and Honorary members have no voting rights

Members will be accepted through decision of the executive committee.
Termination of membership is open to individual members at all times upon



written notification to the executive committee (email/fax included). The terminating member is required to pay the complete annual membership-fee for the year commenced.

Membership may be revoked at any time through decision of the general assembly upon petition of the executive committee.

Art. 4 Assets

The main sources of income of the association are:

- Annual membership-fee
- Donations and gifts
- Subsidies

Art. 5 Organisation

The governing bodies of the association are:

- The general assembly
- The executive committee
- The financial auditing

Art. 6 General Assembly

The general assembly consists of members and is to take place annually. An extraordinary assembly may be called in by the executive committee or by 1/5 of the members upon presentation of purpose to the executive committee.

The invitation to the general assembly shall be in writing (email/fax included) and include the points of action.

Minutes of every general assembly are taken. The further procedural details of the assembly are governed by regulations enacted by the executive committee.

Art. 7 Duties

The general assembly sees to the following duties:

- To preside over the activities of the executive committee
- To elect financial auditors
- To elect executive committee members
- To take note and release the yearly balance, oversee management of the executive committee
- To decide upon statute amendments
- To decide on motions put forward by the executive committee
- To designate the yearly membership-fee

The procedures of the general assembly are designated by the general assembly through enactment of regulations pertaining there to.

Art. 8 The Executive Committee

The executive committee oversees the management of day to day business of the association and is responsible for its representation. Members of the



executive committee are elected for the period of two years. Re-election is possible. The executive committee consists of a maximum of 15 members. The president must be elected from amongst the executive committee.

The division of duties amongst members of the executive committee and its procedures is designated by the executive committee through enactment of regulations pertaining there to.

Art. 9 Financial Auditing

The general assembly elects two auditors bi-annually, responsible for reviewing annual accounts and petition to the general assembly.

Art. 10 Liability

The association's assets are solely liable for its obligations. Members are excluded from any personal liability.

Art. 11 Liquidation

The association may be liquidated by decision of an extraordinary general assembly called in for this purpose and by a 2/3 majority-vote.

In the case of liquidation of the association, its assets are donated to another non-profit organisation pursuant to the association's purpose. A division amongst members is strictly forbidden.

Art. 12 Non-Profit

The association is a non-profit organisation.

The revision of statutes shall come into effect immediately after approval by the general assembly.
